- Do Your Research

 ☐ Make a list of the features most important to you in a college
 Consider size, academics, location, cost, housing, campus life, athletics, and religious affiliation

 ☐ Use the internet to research your college choices
 Don't overlook talking with your parents, counselors, teachers, coaches, current college students, and other people you admire

 ☐ Schedule a virtual or in-person visit with your college guidance office

 ☐ Attend virtual and/or onsite college fairs to experience your college choices
- Stay Organized
 □ Create a folder for each college of interest
 □ Put together a master calendar with "don't miss" dates:
 □ Special events (Open Houses, Major Days)
 □ Application deadlines (Early Decision, Early Action or Regular)
 □ Deadlines for financial aid and scholarships
 □ Start writing your essay(s) if required
 □ Keep copies of all important admissions documents

 ☐ Take the SAT or ACT if required (NOTE: Some colleges no
 - longer require scores for admission but they may be needed for scholarship consideration or admission to selective programs)

 Don't wait until the last minute to collect supporting
 - __ **Don't wait until the last minute** to collect supporting documents and submit your completed application!

 Application requirements can differ by college, but a complete application typically includes:
 - High school transcript (Request from your high school counselor)
 - SAT/ACT scores
 - Letters of recommendation from teachers and counselors
 - Student essay
