Graduate Academic Distinction Award - Spring 2024






Salmon n' Bannock Indigenous restaurant class visit

On a Thursday afternoon in October, Professor Michael Lever took students enrolled in his Entrepreneurship and You course to visit one of the few Indigenousowned and managed restaurants in Vancouver. During their visit, students met with Inez Cook and tried an assortment of popular dishes, including traditional Bannock, Pemmican mousse, sage-blueberries, and game sausages. During their visit, Inez described her experience as an Indigenous woman and entrepreneur and how those experiences have led her to where she is today. Professor Lever has been taking students to this restaurant each year to give them new perspectives of important voices in the tourism and hospitality industry.

Andre Kuerbis's Guest Visit for HRTM 7746 Students

The students in Professor Lever's Entrepreneurship and You course were pleased to welcome Andre Kuerbis to the class to talk about his experience in the hospitality industry and his subsequent work as a small business owner helping other businesses in B.C. with their bookkeeping. While the entire conversation was enlightening and sparked a great discussion among himself and the students, Andre discussed the importance of having an effective plan as a business owner in the hospitality industry. He stated that "...the results of a business plan are as valuable as the approach. This allows you in the future to do it with more structure. It's about doing it." In his parting words, Andre told the students that the tourism industry is special, and that people are more passionate and willing to share, and that for him, "hospitality is not about getting heads in beds, but sharing stories and opening our doors to visitors". This prestigious recognition highlights the Centre's eco-friendly design, energy efficiency, and low carbon footprint. During the tour, students explored both front- and back-of-house areas, learning how features like the green roof and advanced water conservation systems set a standard for sustainability in large hospitality venues.









Visiting Selkirk College

As part of Selkirk College's School of Hospitality & Tourism Industry Advisory Committee, Dr. Jarrett Bachman traveled to Nelson, BC on October 16 & 17. Dr. Jarrett Bachman participated in panels with faculty, students, and industry discussing student learning, industry trends, and future opportunities.
