

Full-Tuition Orton-Gillingham Graduate Scholarships

Advance Your Teaching Skills With Structured Literacy Training

Fairleigh Dickinson University's Center for Dyslexia Studies invites you to apply for one of its full-tuition scholarships in Orton-Gillingham teacher training — valued at \$11,800 — offered in partnership with the Children's Dyslexia Centers and funded by the Scottish Rite Masons of New Jersey.

About the Scholarship

This teacher training scholarship covers the cost of 12 graduate credits for four courses in FDU's nationally accredited Orton-Gillingham (OG) Teacher Certificate. These courses are the core of FDU's Orton-Gillingham Dyslexia Specialist Training Program. Credits earned also can be applied toward select graduate studies at FDU's School of Education.

Orton-Gillingham training prepares teachers to better support struggling readers — including students with dyslexia.

Orton-Gillingham is a structured literacy approach that includes:

- Direct, explicit instruction
- Systematic, cumulative and rule-based strategies
- Multisensory reinforcement
- Extensive review
- Success-oriented learning

About the Program

Scholarship recipients attend lecture sessions and engage in supervised practicum experiences at one of these five Children's Dyslexia Centers of New Jersey locations:

- Burlington
- Hasbrouck Heights
- Northfield
- Scotch Plains
- Tenafly

Practicum sessions meet twice each week for approximately 15 weeks each semester. It takes four semesters (two academic years) to complete the program. During each practicum session, teachers use the Orton-Gillingham approach to instruct struggling readers. Teachers generally instruct one child at 4:30 p.m. and another at 5:30 p.m.

Application Information for Fall 2025

We are currently accepting applications for Fall 2025. Please submit your application & all required documents by April 23, 2025, for consideration. Scholarship awards will be announced in May 2025.

The application process requires submission of the following:

- Scholarship application
- Two letters of recommendation
- A current résumé
- Copy of a current teaching certificate
- Copy of college/graduate transcripts

The program offers ideal training for special education teachers, as well as classroom teachers in primary, middle and secondary schools who are interested in improving their skills in supporting struggling readers.

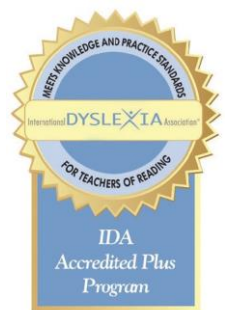
