#### MHMS Students Attend Degree Quality Assessment Board Meeting

The Degree Quality Assessment Board (DQAB) is an independent advisory body in British Columbia that oversees the quality assurance of degree programs. It ensures that new degree proposals meet high academic standards, benefiting students and the post-secondary system. In March, Master of Hospitality Management students attended a DQAB meeting, gaining firsthand insight into the rigorous evaluation process for academic programs. Observing these deliberations provided students with a deeper understanding of quality assurance in higher education and its role in shaping industry-relevant programs. This experience reinforced the importance of maintaining high educational standards and preparing students for leadership roles in hospitality and tourism.



#### Tourism Industry Association of British Columbia Annual Conference

The Tourism Industry Association of British Columbia (TIABC) hosted its annual BC Tourism Industry Conference from March 5 to 7, 2025, at the Sheraton Vancouver Wall Centre.
